Dear HAVEN supporters and friends,

I am so honored to serve on HAVEN's Board of Directors and to see first-hand the passion, skill and creativity with which HAVEN services are delivered to survivors of intimate partner violence and sexual assault and their children. Because of supporters, donors and community partners like you, HAVEN's staff of professionals is able to provide a range of services that help survivors in their journey to a safe life.

I started this servant leadership role in 2014 and have seen so much advancement in the tailor-made programming HAVEN's staff delivers to our community. These programs span a wide spectrum of needs, from specially developed counseling programs for survivors, to free community conferences that inform law enforcement, prosecutors, judges and professional health care workers about dangerous abuse tactics such as felony strangulation.

This year at HAVEN has been a time for rejuvenation, growth, and expansion. In keeping with our transformation, HAVEN has a new mission and vision statement designed to highlight our empowerment-based model and the necessity of engaging communities in the fight against domestic and sexual violence.

HAVEN's mission is to empower survivors to heal, and to engage all individuals and communities to address and prevent sexual assault and intimate partner violence.

HAVEN's vision is to eradicate sexual assault and intimate partner violence and heal those affected by its injustice.

At HAVEN, we recognize that violence against women does not exist in a vacuum – it's a product of systemic inequality and is affected by the attitudes, cultural beliefs, and ideology of the people around us. This means we need to expand our efforts to engage communities in the fight to end gender-based violence.

Innovative ways we have grown in 2018

- To truly tackle intimate partner violence and sexual assault at its roots, we expanded our Prevention Education program to include three new Education Specialists. HAVEN's Prevention Education program educates almost 11,000 individuals every year, changing hearts and minds in classrooms and professional settings across Oakland County. Our Prevention Education program is now more equipped than ever to empower young men to take ownership of their behaviors and help young women to recognize the impact of their voices in society. This year we established Prevention Education programming at three new schools, two community agencies and one college.
- Our Prevention Education team also developed a specialized referral process for survivors currently incarcerated in Oakland County Jail. Our staff trained case managers in the implementation of this new process.
- We have also recognized the unique needs faced by children exposed to intimate partner violence. This year, HAVEN launched the Children's Health Initiative, a project designed to address kids' needs for safe and structured play, healthy activity, and nutrition education. Continuing our emphasis on children, we have also expanded HAVEN's Summer Camp and Male Mentorship Program in partnership with the Association for Corporate Growth. In addition, 15 staff members and volunteers attended PLAYWORKS training that focused on the engagement of children in healthy physical activities. These programs are designed to give children and youth positive role models and engaging experiences that help them cope with the impact of trauma.
- In 2017-2018 HAVEN secured a partnership with Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak to train nursing staff in the trauma-informed management of survivors in ER.
- In May of 2018, through the support of the Cooper Standard Foundation and its employees, HAVEN was able to complete **Darian's Playground** for HAVEN's children. The playground was named in honor of Darian Locklear, a wonderful young woman who stood against bullying in her school and sadly lost her life in a car accident.
- **HAVEN's Blossom GALA**, hosted at the Royal Oak Farmers Market, attracted a record number of over 400 supporters and succeeded in raising \$308,000 net.
- On September 5th and 6th 2018, HAVEN's Director of START organized and hosted "**Strangulation: The Last Warning Shot**" Conference in coordination with the Strangulation Prevention Institute and community partners. The conference was attended by 168 community partners including law enforcement, prosecutors, judges and professional health care workers.

Typical non-profit organizations spend from 15 to 40 percent of revenue on administrative costs. As a donor and supporter of HAVEN you will be pleased to learn that HAVEN spends 83% of the operating revenue on direct services for survivors of intimate partner violence and sexual assault and their families.

We wholeheartedly thank you for your generous support. By working together, we can realize a world free of intimate partner violence and sexual assault.

HAVEN Programs | We're more than a shelter

Counseling Program

The HAVEN Counseling program serves adults and children who have been impacted by intimate partner violence and sexual assault. Specialized groups and individual counseling provides support, guidance, insight and information into the complicated dynamics of abuse, violence and assault. Therapeutic support is based on a trauma informed empowerment based model. Each HAVEN therapist is a Master's level counselor or social worker and holds a license in the state of Michigan. The quality of our counseling services is best in class.

Resource and Community Partnership Program

HAVEN's Resource and Community Partnership program is a one-stop resource for survivors to realize their path to stability. The program provides survivors with resources for medical, financial, and legal services.

Survivors can work with "resource room" staff to find housing and employment. HAVEN staff, volunteers, corporate partners and other non-profits pull together to assist survivors in reaching personal goals. Monthly workshops and one-on-one assistance are available.

Crisis and Support Line

The HAVEN Crisis and Support Line never closes, serving callers 24 hours per day, 365 days per year. The support line provides crisis intervention, understanding and support, safety planning, referrals and information to those affected by intimate partner violence and sexual assault. Fully trained specialists field both phone calls and online chat requests.

Social Action

HAVEN's First Response/Court Advocates are available around the clock, 365 days a year for survivors. They provide immediate crisis intervention and emotional support for victims and their family members at Oakland County hospitals and police stations following an assault. They are trained to work side-by-side with survivors as they move through the complex legal system providing support and education. HAVEN's personal protection order (PPO) office is also staffed by Court Advocates. They guide survivors on creating personal safety plans including the filing of a PPO when necessary.

Prevention Education

Our skilled, experienced educators train audiences of all ages. They work with students, pre-school aged through college, their teachers and their parents to equip them with the tools to build healthy relationships based on mutual respect and the meaning of consent. HAVEN educators provide professional training to law enforcement and healthcare providers on recognizing and responding to intimate partner violence and sexual assault. They also provide training to the public on the dynamics of intimate partner violence and sexual assault and the root causes of violence against women.

START - Safe Therapeutic Assault Response Team

Licensed forensic nurse examiners provide comprehensive medical forensic exams and compassionate emotional care for survivors of sexual assault. Examiners are especially trained in evidence collection and court testimony. Beginning in fiscal year 2017, START was certified to conduct pediatric exams for victims of sexual assault under the age of 11.

Residential Program

HAVEN's Residential Shelter program is Oakland County's only 24-hour emergency shelter exclusively for intimate partner violence and sexual assault survivors and their children. HAVEN's residential clients not only experience a safe living environment where they are able to regain control of their lives, they have access to all HAVEN programs. Our residential youth program offers a safe and nurturing environment for children to express themselves through structured arts, crafts and play.

Volunteers and Interns

HAVEN has a robust volunteer and intern program. Volunteer opportunities range from one-time group projects to long-term volunteer assignments working alongside our staff. We think of our volunteers as the cornerstone of our programs. HAVEN interns are college students earning credits and gaining real-life experience in their field of interest. It's not unusual for a HAVEN intern to be hired upon graduation.


