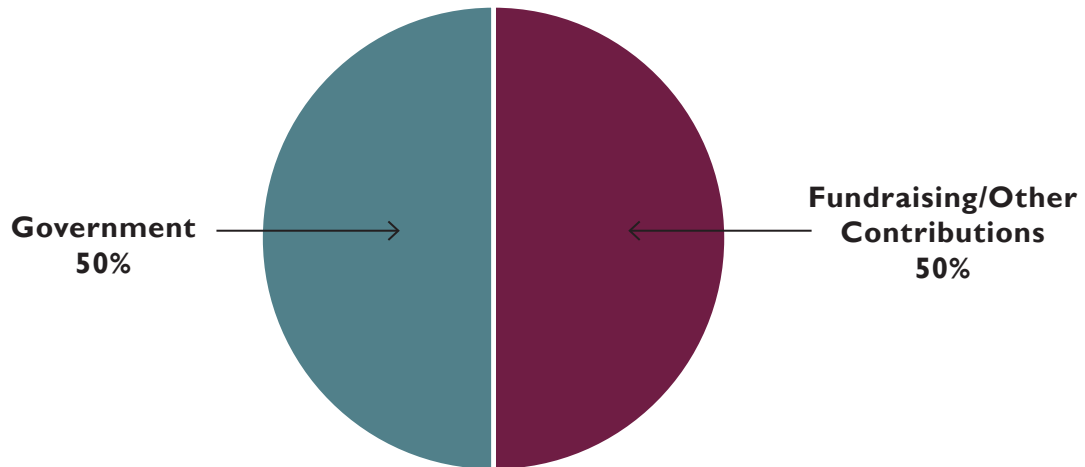

In 2023-2024 HAVEN Inc. **raised \$4,498,500** in operating funds from these sources:

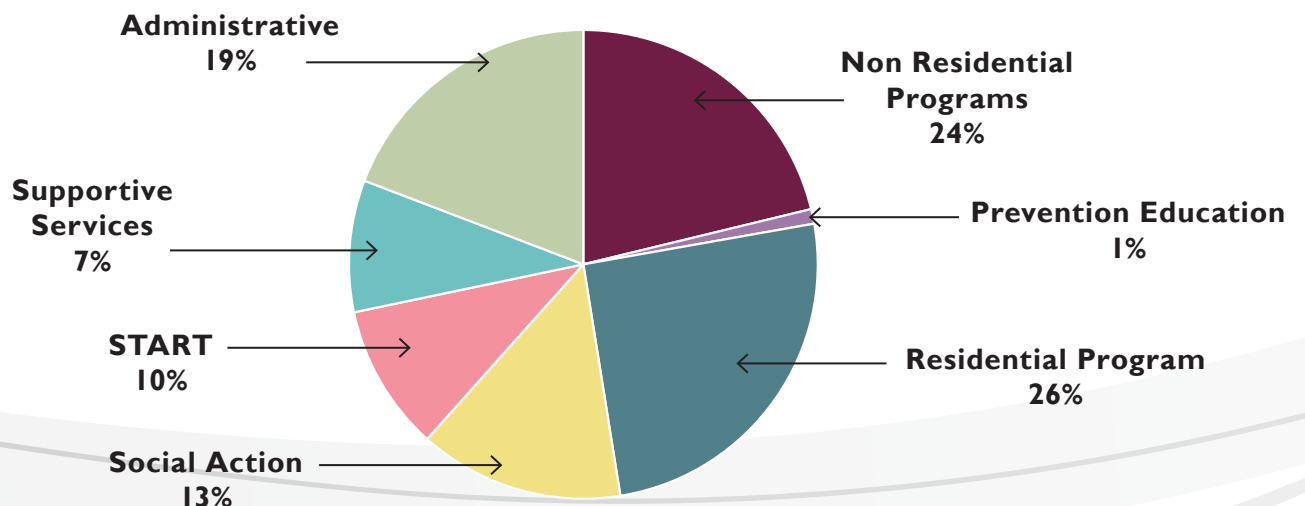
