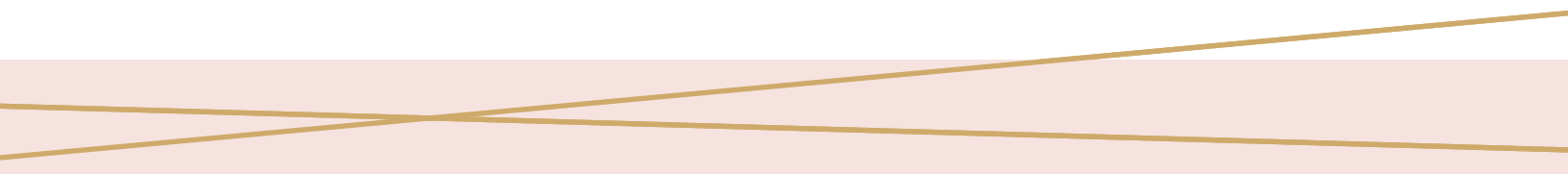

HAVEN is Oakland County’s only non-profit agency that offers comprehensive services for victims of intimate partner violence and sexual assault, providing a 24/7 crisis line, emergency shelter, medical forensic exams, counseling, court advocacy, community resources and prevention education to more than 30,000 people each year in Oakland County and surrounding areas.

WHY HAVEN MATTERS RIGHT NOW



For 50 years, HAVEN has stood beside survivors of intimate partner violence and sexual assault during some of the most difficult moments of their lives. While progress has been made in awareness, prevention, and survivor support, the realities facing survivors today remain urgent and increasingly complex.

The Scope of the Issue

Nationally, **more than 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men experience intimate partner violence** during their lifetime, while millions more are impacted by sexual violence, stalking, coercive control, and emotional abuse. In Oakland County and across Michigan, survivors continue to face growing challenges related to housing instability, financial insecurity, mental health concerns, childcare access, and long-term trauma recovery.

What Survivors Are Facing

At HAVEN, these realities are reflected every day in the **calls we answer, the shelter we provide, and the services we deliver**. Survivors often arrive seeking not only immediate safety, but also support navigating legal systems, financial dependence, medical concerns, and the lasting effects of trauma on themselves and their children.

Rising Concerns

One of the growing concerns in intimate partner violence response is the increased recognition of **strangulation as a highly lethal form of abuse**. Through HAVEN's **START Program**, survivors receive **trauma-informed forensic nursing care, advocacy, and compassionate medical support** following violence and assault.

Funding Challenges

Compounding these challenges are growing concerns surrounding the future of **victim services funding nationwide**. Declining **VOCA (Victims of Crime Act) funding** continues to create uncertainty for organizations serving survivors at a time when the **need for services remains high**.

HAVEN's Commitment

Despite these challenges, HAVEN remains steadfast in its **commitment to survivors**. Through the support of **donors, volunteers, community partners, advocates, and public funding**, HAVEN continues to provide **emergency shelter, counseling, advocacy, prevention education, forensic nursing response, and 24/7 crisis support** to individuals and families across our community.

Looking Ahead

The need for HAVEN has not gone away. **In many ways, it has never been greater**. Together, we continue building pathways toward **safety, healing, hope, and prevention** for survivors today, and for generations to come.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

Survivors do not navigate violence, trauma, or healing alone, and neither does HAVEN.

For more than 50 years, HAVEN has worked alongside community partners across Oakland County to build a coordinated, survivor-centered response to intimate partner violence and sexual assault. These partnerships strengthen access to safety, justice, healing, and long-term support for thousands of individuals and families each year.

Through collaboration with the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office, law enforcement agencies, hospitals, courts, and community organizations, HAVEN helps ensure survivors receive compassionate, informed, and coordinated care at every stage of their journey.

Key Partnerships Include:

- **The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office and local law enforcement agencies**, working together to support survivor safety, advocacy, evidence collection, and access to justice.
- **Care House of Oakland County**, collaborating to support children and families impacted by abuse through coordinated services and trauma-informed care.
- **Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN) and Common Ground**, partnering to address the complex intersection of violence, mental health, crisis response, and community support services.
- **Hospitals and healthcare professionals throughout the region**, including partnerships connected to HAVEN's START Program (Safe Therapeutic Assault Response Team), ensuring survivors of sexual assault and strangulation have access to compassionate forensic medical care and advocacy.
- **Courts and legal partners across Oakland County**, helping survivors navigate Personal Protection Orders, court advocacy, and legal resources during some of the most difficult moments of their lives.

These collaborations reflect HAVEN's longstanding commitment to a comprehensive community approach, one that recognizes survivor safety and healing require strong partnerships, shared accountability, and systems working together.

Together, we are building a safer, more responsive community where survivors are supported, believed, and empowered to heal.

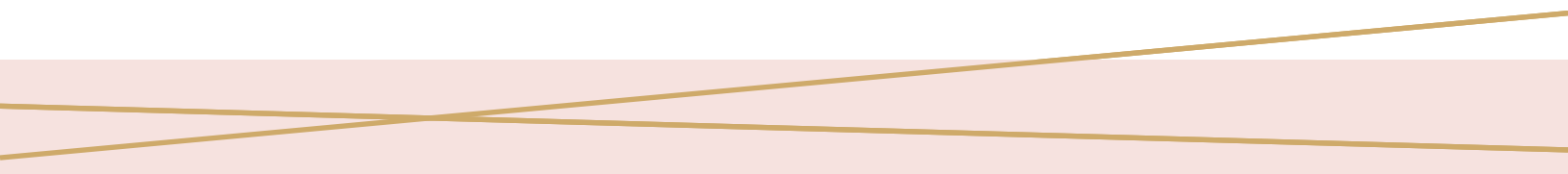
HONORING OUR STAFF

POWER OF COMMUNITY IN ACTION

At HAVEN, **volunteers and interns** are an essential part of the compassionate community that surrounds survivors with care, dignity, and hope. This year, volunteers and interns contributed **3,651 hours of service**, representing an estimated value of **more than \$120,000** in support of HAVEN's mission.*

But their impact reaches far beyond numbers. Volunteers and interns help create welcoming, supportive spaces for survivors and families at every stage of healing. From **organizing donations** and **preparing shelter spaces** to **assisting with events, administrative support, children's activities, community outreach, and survivor-centered programs**, their presence helps strengthen HAVEN's ability to respond to the growing needs of our community. **Graduate and undergraduate interns** also play an important role across **counseling, advocacy, and support services**, bringing **compassion, dedication, and a commitment to learning** while gaining hands-on experience supporting survivors of intimate partner violence and sexual assault.

Whether assembling **welcome items for families entering shelter**, helping maintain our campus and donation spaces, supporting **fundraising events**, or standing alongside staff during **community initiatives**, volunteers and interns help ensure survivors feel **seen, supported, and cared for**. Their generosity of time and talent reflects the **power of community in action**, and the belief that **healing happens when people come together to support one another**.

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP & SUSTAINABILITY

Stewardship and Impact

At HAVEN, every dollar entrusted to our mission represents more than funding, it represents **safety, healing, advocacy,** and **hope** for survivors and families across our community.

In 2024 - 2025, HAVEN remained deeply committed to responsible stewardship and mission driven impact. **More than 80% of organizational expenditures directly supported survivor programs and services**, including emergency shelter, counseling, advocacy, forensic nursing care, prevention education, crisis intervention, and community support services.

Community Support and Funding Strength

Through the generosity of our donors, grant partners, foundations, government agencies, corporate supporters, and community advocates, HAVEN raised more than **4.3 million dollars in operating support** to sustain lifesaving programs for survivors of intimate partner violence and sexual assault.

Our funding reflects a diversified network of support, including government grants, individual philanthropy, foundations, fundraising events, corporate giving, in kind contributions, and community partnerships. **This broad base of support strengthens HAVEN's ability to respond to survivor needs** while building long term organizational stability.

Sustainability and the Path Forward

As the landscape of victim service funding continues to evolve, particularly amid ongoing uncertainty surrounding federal and VOCA funding, HAVEN remains focused on thoughtful sustainability planning and strategic resource management. We continue to **strengthen donor engagement, expand philanthropic partnerships, and invest in long term operational resilience** to ensure survivors can access critical services today and in the future.

Because of the compassion and generosity of our community, HAVEN continues to stand as a safe place for survivors to turn in moments of crisis and throughout their healing journey.

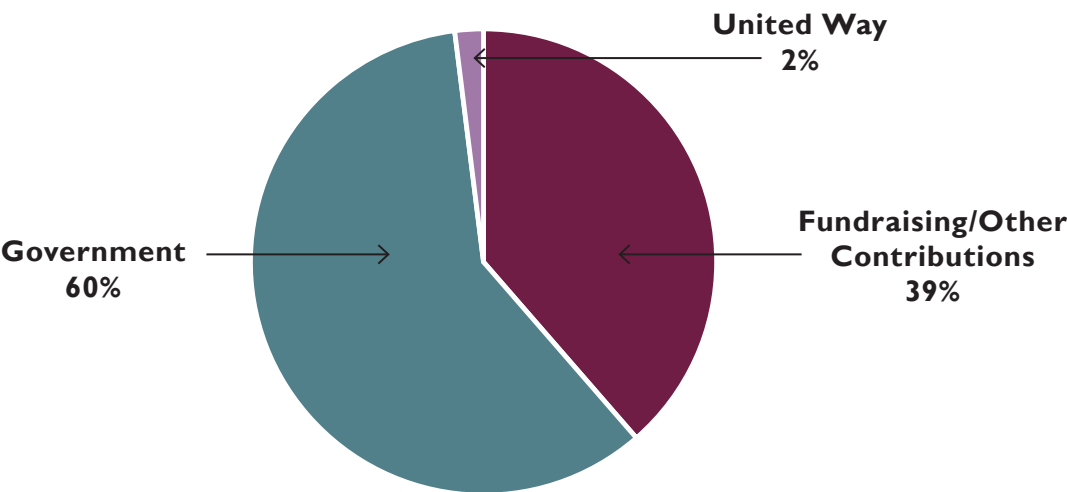

In 2024-2025 HAVEN Inc. **raised \$4,334,012** in operating funds from these sources:

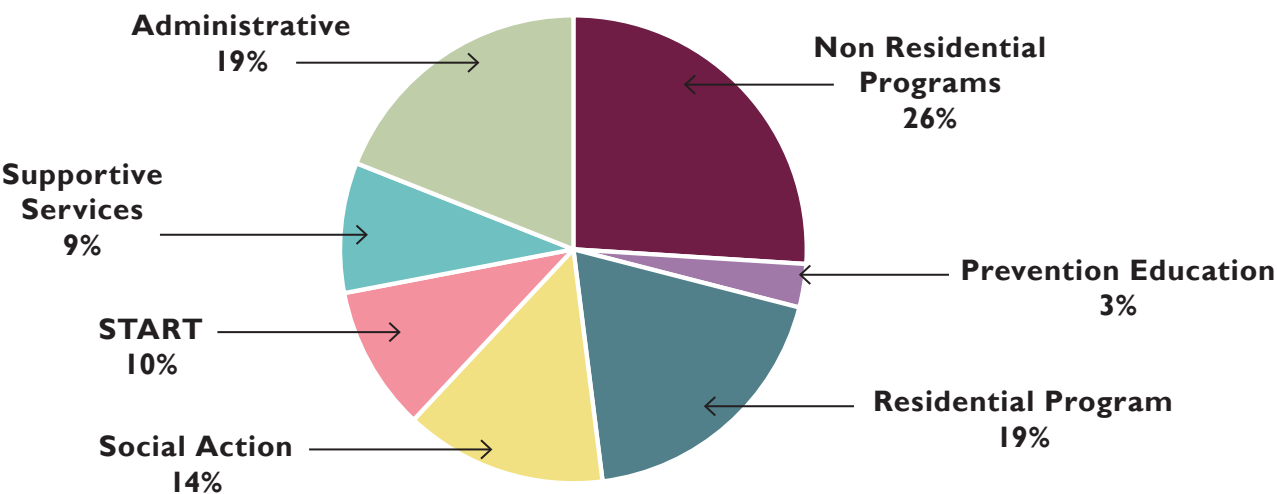
